Frank J. Scarano, PhD, MLT(ASCP)M CM—Nominee for AMTF President-Elect 2024



Frank has 39 years of clinical laboratory experience and approximately 35 years of experience in some aspect of teaching, with 26 years as a faculty member in the Department of Medical Laboratory Science at the University of Massachusetts

Dartmouth. He has been an active member in ASCLS, serving at the local, regional, and national level in a variety of roles over the past 25 years (a few examples include: Microbiology Scientific

Assembly vice-chair, and then chair; Abstract Review Committee (ARC) member, chair, and then chair again as ARC transitioned to APRC; ASCLS (national) Nominations Committee (elected three times due to committee term restructuring); Consumer Response Team; ASCLS:CNE Treasurer for six terms; ASCLS:CNE Director for two two-year terms; ASCLS:CNE Finance Chair for two terms; ASCLS:CNE Nominations committee for two terms, ASCLS:CNE Annual Convention Planning Committee for many years). Frank currently serves as a Director on the ASCLS Board. Frank has attended just about every ASCLS National Meeting since 1999 (he stayed home the year his daughter was an infant) and has served as a delegate from ASCLS:CNE for the vast majority of those annual meetings.
